PROJECT

CLEAN EARTH COFFEE SCRUB



NEED

The Clean Earth Coffee Scrub was born from our idea to upcycle and reuse spent coffee grounds from across the UNE campus cafés. Over the course of a year, 3.7 tonnes of this waste is generated on campus alone.

ACTION

Enactus UNE has found a way to significantly reduce landfill and methane emissions from this otherwise wasted resource. We have created an exfoliating body scrub, an excellent value add product. We have designed 3 products to differentiate and increase market share. The aim of this project is to create a viable product with minimal environmental impact.

OUTCOME

The outcome of a single 250g scrub reduces the environmental impact of spent coffee grounds produced by approximately 17 cups of coffee. We aim to mitigate the waste of 4,420 cups of coffee, annually.

MOVING FORWARD

Partnerships will be formed to upscale and upskill where possible, with an aim to maximise the environmental and social benefit of the project.



PROJECT DRIVE TO THRIVE



NEED

240 refugees from Syria, Iraq and Myanmar are in the process of being resettled in the Armidale and New England Region. The significant cultural differences, language barriers, and local issues are factors that hinder smooth immersion in to Australian culture.

ACTION

A car has been donated to Sanctuary Armidale to use as a resource to teach these refugees to drive and also as a taxi to acquire groceries, and take these families to appointments and interviews. Sustainable Living Armidale has been granted a parcel of land to be used as a market garden by these refugees who have strong farming backgrounds.

OUTCOME

This project will assist these refugees to develop a fully integrated value chain where they can reach their full potential in a safe and supportive environment. These new members of society will fully contribute to the wider community and help to create a more diverse local region, generating a more prosperous economy.

MARKETS IN THE MALL



CONSULT

NEED

Small to medium enterprises and microbusiness have been locked out in our regional economy that favours a higher proportion of externally owned businesses. Over the last 15 years there has been a noticeable decline in both stall holders and foot traffic at the monthly Markets in the Mall.

We have collaborated with the Rotary Club of Armidale AM and the Police and Community Youth Club to reverse this downward trend. We have conducted broad market research through a series of surveys of stall holders, customers, and existing established businesses.
