We have been working throughout the year to further develop and enhance the Suited Up project and increase its reach. Through the refurbishing of unusable clothing, we have engaged with 80 people to create over 70 items. We have sold 47 shirts, 14 jackets, 31 trousers, 16 skirts and 23 accessories generating the revenue to purchase 3 sewing machines and much needed sewing equipment. Our new partnerships with community volunteers and charity organisations enabled us to empower 50 people with confidence in their pursuit to employment.

Our Project 'Suited Up'

OUR MISSION

At first, our project was a means by which our Curtin Enactus members reused lightly worn workwear to suit up members in our community who are facing financial hardship, in their pursuit to employment. Now, we have developed our Suited Up Project to involve suiting up members in our community with confidence, breaking down the stigma associated with economic hardships, and providing the opportunity for people to unleash their potential.

Suited Up, now reuses lightly worn unwanted workwear as well as resell and refurbish unwanted clothing and materials. This creates a safe space for people to connect, as well as gain meaningful work experience, with a social and environmental impact. Suited Up is a community empowerment project that not only makes a difference in today's society and environment but also has the momentum to create new ventures and spark business innovation.

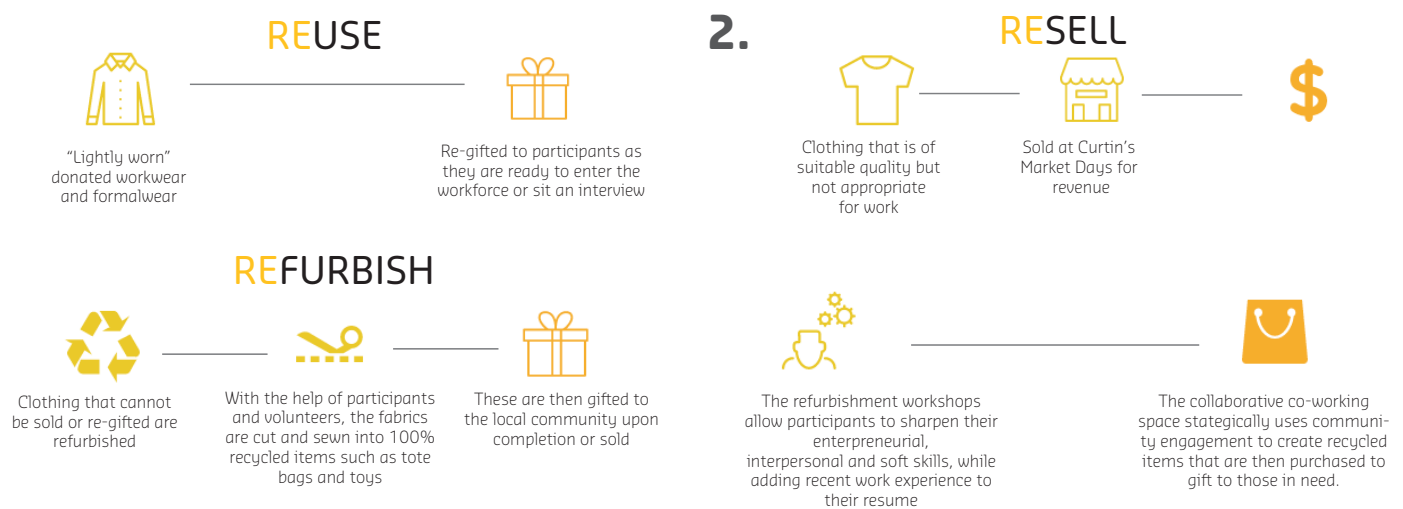
Suited Up has been simply designed so that it can be scaled and replicated, by any institution in any part of the world.

OUR EXPANSION



We have expanded to Foyer Oxford, an organisation who house youth aged 16-25, who are seeking employment, education or training. Our partnership involves collaborative sessions where the young Australians develop their entrepreneurial skills, and in a peer to-peer environment, work alongside our Enactus Curtin students, with the hope to independently run Suited Up.



We have already expanded to the students at the university of Adelaide, who have begun reaching out to university staff and their peers, to conduct the reuse, re-selling and refurbishing of unwanted clothing in South Australia, enabling the progress of their community along the way.



The Rafiki Childcare Program provides a loving home for up to 100 Ugandan orphans in the Rafiki Training Village. We conduct collection drives specifically for children's clothing. We also send refurbished toys sewn here in our community. To finance this, we took to our Curtin staff the ability to buy the toys enabling us to gift to the children in need.
