Helping Hands is the recruitment tool used by Griffith ENACTUS to engage and attract new student members. As our club members are multidisciplinary, Helping Hands events are typically one-off events led by student leaders who are passionate about a particular cause. These events enable like-minded students to work together on a project and make a positive difference. In 2018 Griffith ENACTUS has continued

to facilitate Helping Hands events, in line with members' interests and community needs. We continued our collaboration with the Treak Community Centre, with Lesson Planning days where Griffith ENACTUS students developed English language lessons for our partners in Cambodia. Closer to home, we had students participate in Rosie's Street Outreach, Beeralong Community Farm, Bridge to Brisbane and a local Zambrero

Meal Packing day.

Helping Hands allows us to engage with our community whilst developing professional skills. This structure further provides partner organisations with an avenue to work with our club in order to build upon their project outcomes. Domestic violence is currently at the forefront of discussion and Griffith ENACTUS continues to educate, inform and empower people in the community. 1 in 6 women and 1 in 20 men have experienced violence from a current or former partner since the age of 15. More than one woman dies each week from domestic violence. 95% of men and 80% of women have never contacted the police. Our MATES aims to provide a platform for discussion around this issue and empowers students to become active bystanders

Effective Empowerment

- Griffith ENACTUS is giving members of the community the tools to recognize and assist those suffering from domestic violence.

Livelihood Assets Human

- For the 2017-2018 period, MVP currently has 20 registrations for its 'train the trainer' workshop which will be held in Trimester 2, 2018.
- Direct empowerment of participants to make a difference through the Griffith Mates Club.
- Hosted the second annual public forum on domestic violence at Griffith University, with key speakers represented from institutions including

Children by Choice and Centre Against Sexual Violence.

Social

- Broader network – MVP Facebook page currently has 261 likes. Viewers receive relevant content such as facts about domestic violence and tips for intervening as a bystander.
- Program specifically tailored to promote a community comprised of a diverse range of participants.
- Reversal of typical isolating nature of gendered violence.
- Reducing stigma surrounding domestic violence issues.

Griffith ENACTUS is excited to launch its newest project: our Anti-Idling Campaign. Idling, the act of running a vehicle's engine without movement, is an invisible killer. Griffith ENACTUS aims to start locally, raising awareness about idling at our own University and Gold Coast schools using different methods to create awareness such as using social media, free information sessions and signage on campus.

Short term empowerment

- Our goal is to create 'Green Zones' to set an achievable example for others. 'Green Zones' mark off areas in which vehicles are not allowed to idle making the air significantly cleaner and safer for passers-by.

Long term empowerment

- As a long-term goal, we hope to inspire universities, schools and their students to take part in the awareness campaign for anti-idling, setting up their own Green Zones in their respective areas.


